A Whippet game-By Abby

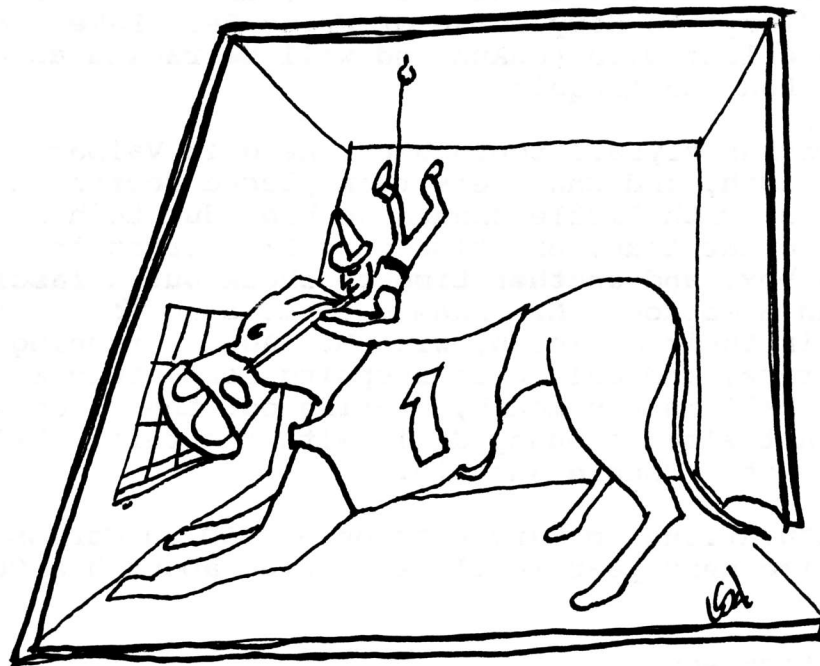

Classified Ads

Ule James would be willing to make lure machines for CWA members for \$150 (\$200 for non-members), which is a bargain considering that a rebuilt motor alone goes for \$70.00, and the rest of the materials cost \$35.00. A machine takes 8 hrs of work. At this price the lure machine will not include line, or a pulley, which you need if you don't want the dogs to run towards the lure machine rather than towards a pulley, and it will not be painted. Note: A pulley will be an extra \$20.00, the line will be \$18.50, and a paint job will be \$10.00. If you are interested please drop Ule James a line. One word of caution, alot of the speed of this lure machine is due to the battery you use, so there is no guarantee that the lure machine will perform fast enough for racemeets, so you must check this yourself with different batteries.

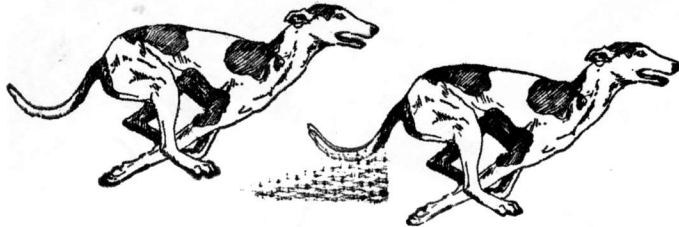
