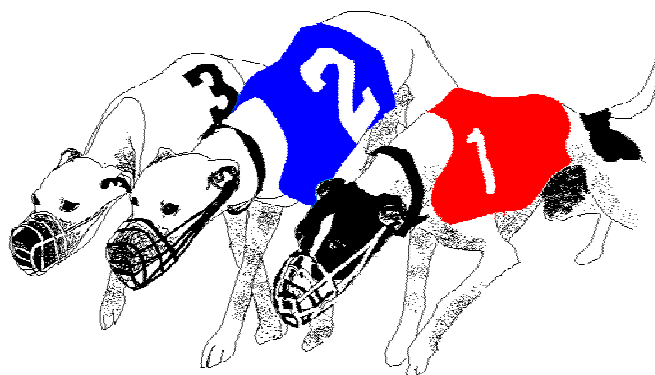

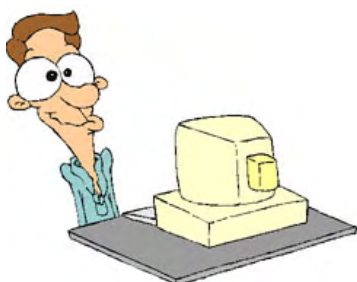

THOSE PESKY FLEAS.....

The next day, I felt the familiar catch in my throat as Belker's family surrounded him. Shane seemed so calm, petting the old dog for the last time that I wondered if he understood what was going on. Within a few minutes, Belker slipped peacefully away.

The little boy seemed to accept Belker's transition without any difficulty or confusion. We sat together for a while after Belker's death, wondering aloud about the sad fact that animal lives are shorter than human lives.

Shane, who had been listening quietly, piped up, "I know why." Startled, we all turned to him. What came out of his mouth next stunned me. I'd never heard a more comforting explanation. It has changed the way I try and live.

He said, "People are born so that they can learn how to live a good life -- like loving everybody all the time and being nice, right? Well, dogs already know how to do that, so they don't have to stay as long."

Remember, if a dog was the teacher you would learn things like:

- *When loved ones come home, always run to greet them.
- *Never pass up the opportunity to go for a joyride.
- *Allow the experience of fresh air and the wind in your face to be pure Ecstasy.
- *Take naps.
- *Stretch before rising.
- *Run, romp, and play daily.
- *Thrive on attention and let people touch you.
- *Avoid biting when a simple growl will do.
- *On warm days, stop to lie on your back on the grass.
- *On hot days, drink lots of water and lie under a shady tree.

Casey's Easter Miracle

Eighteen months ago, on October 25th, 2007, a nine-year old, much beloved whippet named Casey was lost in Citrus Heights CA. An inattentive guest left a door unlatched and Casey took himself for an unauthorized walk. His family looked everywhere for him, posted signs, networked, visited the shelters daily for four months, even had his vital stats and photos posted to the NCWFA and WRAP websites, with no sightings, and only one lead: someone a few blocks away saw a 'small greyhound' being called into a car on the day Casey disappeared.

Fast-forward to the Saturday before Easter 2009. I got a call from Greyhound Friends For Life Rescue, a group that has helped up with whippet rescues a few times, that they had been at the Sacramento shelter to pick up a greyhound, and while in the kennels they had come across a sad, emaciated whippet. The dog had been picked up as a stray on the 7th, but instead of just letting me know and relying on our crack team of rescue volunteers to spring him as soon as we could get out there, Barb and Marni felt that he couldn't stay there a second more, so they pulled him along with the grey.

Kellee Livingston and I went by Oakland to pick him up from Marni on Easter Sunday, on our way back from the Sacramento dog show. We walked into Marni's workshop/house in the flats of Oakland, and I saw possibly the skinniest whippet I've even seen. "Winston", as they



were calling him, stood in front of an open door, framed by the afternoon light. I'm not saying that the clouds parted or the angels sang, but I was immediately struck by how familiar this dog looked to me. Those who know me will shake their heads and say, "Guin always thinks they look familiar", but this

little dog really looked like 'someone'. As we talked to Marni, I kept stealing glances over to Winston. Five minutes into our conversation about the shelter, etc, I realized that Winston looked a whole heck of a lot like Crystal, a long-dead whippet bitch, who was owned by former Club members that I used to be very good friends with, and thus had spent a ton of time with over the years. I mentally began racking my brain for where all of Crystal's kids from her one-and-only litter ended up, and my mental inventory stopped when I got to her cute, little son Casey, the dog who was lost long ago. Could this be him? The more I looked at the dog in front of me, the more convinced I became. Distinctive ticked legs: check. His mother's sweet face: check. Scar on the front leg: check. I didn't want Marni to think I was a headcase, so I just mentioned how he looked kind of familiar to me and I would have to check my lost dog records when I got home.

Kellee took poor little Winston home, since I was fearful that my Teddy Whippet, the punk, would try to take this sad, little creature out, since this was one whippet whom he outweighed. I rushed to the computer and looked up the info I had on Casey. This dog sure looked like the photo I had of Casey, but could it really be him after all this time? I sent the photo to Kellee, who thought he looked just like the dog who was lost. In her ever-sensible style she proposed an experiment, and called the dog over to her, saying "Casey, come here". His little head popped up from the dog bed he was on, he trotted over to her, stood in front of her and cocked his head, as if to say "finally, someone remembers who I am!".

Since over a year had passed since Casey went missing, I was really worried that both Kellee and I were nuts, that it couldn't be the same dog. I was worried about alerting his family for no reason and picking at a freshly healed wound, so I elected to send an e-mail with photos to the address I had on file for Debbie, Casey's owner. Kellee kept calling me and telling me how I had to call Casey's family - now - and let them know I might have their dog. After a few calls of this nature, I succumbed and called the number I had on file. I got the machine and left a rather rambling message about how I was from whippet rescue and I might have their dog. Ten minutes later I got a call. A voice that sounded like it had been crying said "Hi Guin, I hear you might have my little man". Debbie was on the highway, on her way back from a show in Arizona (she shows Weimerainers and GSDs). Her college-age daughter Kym had been at home and heard my message. Kym was sceptical, so she turned on the computer and looked at the e-mail and photos. She called her mom in tears, yelling "They found Casey!"

Debbie made arrangements to meet with us the next afternoon, which was the soonest she could get to us from the CA/AZ border, where she was traveling from. I took Winston, who I was now calling Casey, to the vet in the morning, where he got a clean bill of health, except for his weighing only 20.4 pounds. I encountered some traffic on my way over to the foster home, and Debbie was already there when I arrived. I opened the front door, Casey poked his nose in and started pulling me. He was hopping up and down and wagging his tail to beat the band. Debbie was in tears. It was Casey!!



I have no idea where Casey was for these past eighteen months, and he is not telling. He was not out for the whole period, as other than the weight, he looked too good to have been in the elements. Plus, he did not act all feral. My best guess is that the person who called them into their car all those months ago kept him, and they either recently dumped him, or he decided to take matters into his own hands and escape (He does having large swathe of healing skin on the top of his nose, like he maybe dug out of somewhere).

Casey rode home to Sacramento on the seat next to Debbie and once home he proceeded to check out the house and visit with his Wiem pals. After his rounds, he collapsed onto his dog bed,

which Debbie had never given away, even though none of the 'big dogs' would lie in it, and fell into a very deep sleep. He awoke an hour later and tipped his head back and went into the most heartfelt, soul-deep howl that Debbie has ever heard, as if to say "I'm home"!

It really is a miracle!
