

his year's Dairyland Whippet Club's Labor Day events had very pleasant 65-75 degree weather with low humidity. It was a welcome relief from the tropical temperatures and humidity. Saturday and Sunday morning temperatures dipped into the 40's forcing people to wear sweatshirts (Ule had to buy a jacket). The water tubs were not needed on Saturday, but were used on Sunday to cool off the dogs after each race. Whippets competing this weekend were from six states: Georgia, Illinois, Minnesota, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Wisconsin.

The weekend activities began on Friday evening with a group get together dinner at Villagio pasta and pizza restaurant in Menomonee Falls. This restaurant features Italian food, pizza and a special Friday Fish Fry. Dean Wegner has been such a good customer there we all ended up with a complimentary dessert of delicious tiramisu.

Chris Durance-Watkins and Mary Hawemann from Georgia came and helped out with setting up the races and board. They were able to get a first hand experience on putting on a CWA event. Hopefully we will all be able to attend CWA events in Georgia.

Saturday's entry was 31 adult starters and two puppies. There were some excitingly close races both Saturday and Sunday. The race meet was hotly contested for hipoint honors. Rafa, Charlotte and Minnie D all won one hi-point race. These three speedsters came in together in the first two hi point races in a close "goose bump" finish, giving the line judges a real challenge. Rafa ended up winning two hi-point races, giving him first place for the meet, earning 5 ARX and 5 NARX points. This young dog should go on to big racing career. Minnie D placed second for 3 NARX and earning her SRA title. Charlotte placed 3rd earning 1 NARX and passed Spot for first place on the All-Time CWA Race standings. These two outstanding 5 year old sisters have ruled the track for the past 4 years and show no signs of letting up. Tanner took the 3 ARX points, which finished his ARX Title. The last 1 ARX point was split by Augie and Bomber.





The top puppy was Bacon, who ran undefeated against his little sister, Monkey.



Saturday's Conformation Match was judged by Marylou Mader and drew 18 entries. Her selections were: 1st – Fanta, 2nd – Lacy, 3rd – Augie, 4th – Maura.

The entries for Sunday's races were 30 adults and 2 puppies. Not wanting to be undone by the youngster Rafa, Minnie D went on to win three hi-point races and tied for 1st in the other. She earned 5 NARX. Placing 2nd and earning 3 NARX and 5 ARX points was Rafa, who finished his ARX Title. Third for the meet and earning 1 NARX was Ziggy, Rafa's brother. The 3 ARX points went to Augie and the 1 ARX point was captured by Pibb.

The two littermate puppies, Bacon and Garcia, tied in points, each wining one with the other race being a dead heat.

Jackie Fogel judged the Sunday Conformation Match, which drew 17 entries. She awarded CWA ribbons to: 1st Augie, 2nd Fanta, 3rd Pibb and 4th Raisin. Fanta gets credit for the conformation win and is only one win away from DPC eligibility.

The beautiful weather made for a hungry group which devoured the delicious ham made by Peggy Berg. There were two crock pots cooking with deeeelicious beans—one made by Ule James and the other made by Janet Siehndel. There were many tasty side dishes and desserts also.









Lynn and Jeff Ollswang brought a delicious cake, wonderfully decorated by Jeff, to celebrate Jennifer Smith and Devon's MACH 2 Agility Title.

## BRINGING THE FUN BACK TO DOG COMPETITION By Jacquelyn Fogel

ast month I had the good fortune to be invited to attend and judge the conformation match segment of a Continental Whippet Alliance (CWA) event in Milwaukee, WI. It made me want to go out and purchase a whippet, almost, just so I could attend more of these events.

I don't really understand anything about the qualifying, rules, or any of the technical aspects of this sport. I can only be a witness for how I felt about spending a day with the people who compete in these events. It was fun!

I had accepted the invitation to judge this event before I knew that my 89-year old dad

was coming to visit for the week. My Dad suffered a serious heart attack two years ago, and is now quite frail, though up until the heart attack he had been an active world traveler, resisting retirement with every ounce of his being. I was worried that he would be bored, or worse, exhausted, by a day outdoors with avid dog fans. So when I asked him if he wanted to come along, I was surprised that he gave me an enthusiastic yes.

The day was a perfect Wisconsin fall day, sunny and a bit cool in the morning, warming up in the afternoon, and then cooling down again as the sun receded. I got there after all of the measuring-in was done, and several of the heats were already run. Unlike AKC conformation events, I was encouraged to mingle with the dog owners and watch the races, even though I would be judging these same dogs handled by their owners later in the day. How refreshing. No one was trying to prevent me from seeing any of the dogs or their owners. There were no "appearance of impropriety" worries, and no professional handlers talking up their dog-of-the-moment. I asked a lot of questions, and was introduced to many of the participants. My husband was coming later with my Dad and his wife, and I got the silly idea that my "whippets-in-drag" (better known as bedlington terriers) might like to try a race, so I called home and had them bring two of our young girls along with them.

My dad sat at the finish line, and was delighted with the racing – trying to guess which dog would win each heat. The race is a 200 yard straight run, and the dogs acted like this was the most fun thing in the world. Many puppies were being trained to follow the lure, and food and beverages were everywhere. The owners loved to talk about the rules and mechanics of the sport, and a few shared their national rankings, though this did not seem to be an obsession with any of them. When my bedlingtons arrived, we tried to interest them in running a race, but they were afraid of the lure and turned out to be complete racing

duds, to my dismay. But the whippet people were very interested in the two girls, and many of them asked insightful questions about the breed. They seemed genuinely excited to meet them. I did not feel compelled to share their win records with anyone, and enjoyed watching the girls interact with other people in a beautiful park-like setting. I took them off-lead for little while, and they had a great time, too.

Conformation judging was fun, though a bit of a challenge. There are some very nice dogs competing in these events, and picking just four to be in the finals meant I had to leave out some really good dogs. I could not remember who won what race, and had not paid attention to the racing statistics, so that was not at all an influence on my selections, nor were the handlers. Handling ranged from outstanding to obvious novice, but all of the dogs could be easily examined and observed moving, regardless of the handlers' skills. They all had sufficient training to be adequately evaluated. I was impressed by the quality of the dogs, expecting to see exaggerated muscling and bad heads, but that was not the case. All were in excellent condition, and most were quite beautiful. I did not have to worry about any disqualifications because they were not allowed to begin racing competition if they exhibited a disqualifying fault. What a novel idea! We could eliminate a lot of drama in the conformation ring if ALL dogs were examined for disqualifying faults before they went into the ring. Then the judges could concentrate on the dogs' good qualities without worrying about having to excuse a disqualified dog.

The day ended with a fabulous pot-luck dinner, and a brief presentation of awards. My Dad even enjoyed that! I received the best judge's gift ever – two boxes of Whippet cookies (a Canadian product – chocolate covered marshmallow and wafer – I have put my order in with my Winnipeg friends to bring more the next time they come to the States), and a CWA T-shirt. I received a lot of thank-you's from the participants, and we left feeling really great about the day, even though my fake whippets never did learn to chase the lure. They did invite me to bring my girls down for training, and offered some tips for how to get puppies interested in the lure at an early age.

I have told this story to many of my conformation friends, and the reaction is universal — they all wish there was a way to bring this kind of relaxed fun back to conformation events. I have some ideas for things that can be tried, but it would require some changing on the part of the AKC. So for right now I am just going to treasure the memory of a most excellent day with whippet racing people, and pass along the idea that maybe, just maybe, we can some day bring fun back to AKC dog shows, too.

f you're a betting person, you'd bet that if NCWFA is having a CWA race meet, the Bay Area will be having a heat wave. Saturday's high was 98.4 and Sunday's was 101.1.

Ok, let me get to the point - it was very hot, but that didn't impact the turnout. We had a 28 dog entry on Saturday with the Mighty Bolt of Wyndsor taking first place with four impressive runs. Congratulation to Jean for her new ARX dog. Canadian entrants Marshall and Daltrey took second and third. The next four dogs were all Wyndsors' both old and young. Sage gave us an impressive showing both on the track taking 10th place and in the ring taking 2 place to Brad's Ellie. Zevi was high score C and took

third in the ring and Guin's TJ took fourth in the ring. (Ed. Note, Zevi is reported as third in the match in both the write-up and official results, but the third place dog in the photo is actually Zelda.)



In all honesty, all the dogs were winners. They got to run, they got to show, and they were all tired at the end of the day.



On Sunday it was another hot one. First out of 21 whippets was Daltrey, closely followed by his twin Marshall. Miss Jane and her uncle Mr. D were followed by super veteran Bessie, who got two ARX points! Our "pretty show dogs," TJ, Sage, and Ellie, rounded out the

Top Ten, proving you can be fast and look good doing it. Hallie, that good time girl, was awarded the special new "Middle of the Pack" award. At the match, mom-to-be Emily Uyehara judged Minnie first.

We had a hotly contested basket raffle on Saturday. There were a dozen really nice baskets entered, encompassing themes from gardening to Canada, and we raised over 150 dollars to offset the cost of the field. This weekend also was the debut of our new granite trophies for grade awards and high scores. Everyone seemed to really like them!

Our Silken Windhound friends, who had their own meet in conjunction with ours, really helped out, and we couldn't have had out meet without their help. The Canadian contingent pitched right in and helped with set-up, boxing, and finish line judging. We also couldn't have done it without them!



We got through the day without further incident and in the end, carrying on proved very therapeutic and gave us all a chance to be supportive of one another in our shock and sadness.

After more consideration, the decision was once again made to carry on the next day, and Sunday was again another Fireworks showdown, this time between Fred and Marshall, as unfortunately Daltrey was lame after bashing into something at home in the morning. The meet came right down to the wire with Fred and Marshall each winning two high points, so they ended up tied for the meet win, with Marshall winning the final race to take home the prizes. Fred picked up the 4

points with little sister Tina right behind them to take 2 points. Our match judge for Sunday was Kristina Krieck, and Kai again won conformation, Horace 2nd, Tina 3rd and Marshall 4th. Tina's owner, Maria, won Best in Potluck with (eat your heart out mid-westerners!) wonderful local smoked salmon slices served on cream-cheese mini bagels.

Though of course there really is no such thing as a silver lining on such a grave tragedy, it was heartwarming to see our little group, already more of a family than a club, pull together to become even closer.

All in attendance and everyone associated with RFF will never forget dear Holly, and all our sympathy to her grieving owner Carol Chittum on her tragic and untimely loss.

ur October Meet was a special event this year, because for the first time, we accepted a standing invitation to be a part of "Bark in the Park" at Nottingham County Park, a daylong celebration of dogs and dog activities. They've been trying to get us to do a demo/practice/meet for years, but it hadn't worked out until this year. There were the obvious concerns of pet dogs in attendance getting loose and running into the racers, and uncontrolled children running around and getting into the faces of Whippets who had their blood up, but in practice, those two things were non-issues. It was the weather the week prior to our event that gave us the greatest challenges.

We raced the same area that went between the trees and the stream that the 2008 CWA National was held on, but because we'd been subjected to an early season Nor'easter, the park would not allow us to put vehicles near the finish line as had been our prior practice running at Nottingham. This made for a rather more grueling day on Saturday as line judges and officials had to hike up and back to the line from cars, along with catchers, and this slowed everything down. It's faster to go the box from the line than vice-versa--and that's a fact!

Although this track is visually rather weird with the optical illusion induced by the trees, the racing runs well on it. The dogs run straight and we've had no real issues with the track. The spectators we had come down to watch from the Bark in the Park Day were very fascinated to see the racing. They kept good control of their dogs. Member Linda Day greeted them before they got to the boxing area and gave them some information and made sure the leashes and collars on their dogs were secure. She was perfect at greeting the public so that overstressed officials like yours truly didn't have to worry about that. Many thanks.

It was overall a positive experience to exhibit racing to the public. Kristen did a nice job on the informational flyers. I hope that we can do this again. I rented a bullhorn, and may do so again.

As usual, MAWRA needs a few people who aren't running multiple dogs to be willing to show up and help, and this weekend that included Linda Day, Diane Motzkus, and Diana Itter. Our Sunday conformation judge, Hillary Frank, was also very helpful. And Leila's young nephew from France, Jerome, was a lot of help as well.

Saturday morning started with some drama, and there's no other way to put it. In the first races, we had one really major foul which happened in such a way that only one foul judge could clearly see the blanket color of the offender, although it was obvious to all that something very aggressive had occurred. This situation was sorted out via scratching the dogs which were likely involved, either as the aggressor or the aggressed upon. The second event was when a veteran D racer got his muzzle off behind the box and in his frenzy bit his owner multiple times deeply in the thigh. This is a very gentle and sweet dog under almost all other circumstances and it serves as a stark reminder to make sure that the muzzles are secure before approaching the box, and why we muzzle our dogs in the first place. It is as much for our safety as theirs, as racing can be overstimulating to even the sweetest couch potato Whippet, which this dog certainly is. This was 9-year-old Nastar, and his owner Pat was very good to stick around the rest of the weekend in pain and help as she could, considering that she was off to the emergency room on Sunday night with wounds that were pretty nasty-looking. Thank goodness the public wasn't there at that time.

But, all our bad incidents happened early on Saturday and by the time we had racing well underway with public showing up to watch, the rest of the weekend went smoothly and the racing was exceptional, with close racing and some surprises in the field. We also enjoyed a nice cookout on Saturday at a picnic pavilion with my husband, Cliff, serving as grillmaster and everyone else bringing some good eats to share. After a long day of racing, a nice spread of food is much appreciated!

Box operators were me and Carl Morgan. Lure operators were Steve Damron and Kristen Fredericks. Head line judge was Brigitte Greenberg. Trophies were done by Terri De Luca and Breakfast Hospitality by George and Michelle Evans, and Pat Spinazzola, among other contributions. As always, every single owner and participant each day worked very hard doing whatever was needed.



Before the meet, we knew we had some ARX point contenders based on past performance...these were Cruz, Augie, and Bomber. We also had a lot of FTE's coming in and had no idea how they would run. We had ARX-titled dogs who would normally win or place high in the meet, such as Faye-Faye, Stretch, and Paige.

Faye-Faye was coming off a bad injury and stitches, and so while she delighted her owner, Steve, by racing hard, she was below her usual form. Her relative at Licketysplit, however, picked up where she left off with "Beau" coming out of FTE to win the meet both days for 10 ARX. His closest competition was "Bomber", my very young male who took the 3 ARX/NARX both days and seemed to specialize in winning the cheap high point. I need to explain the board and how points work to Bomber. Carola Beranek's dog "Stretch", brought by Carl, was 3rd in the meet both days for 1 NARX each day. The competition for the 1 ARX was not as close as expected. Augie, who had run so well in Milwaukee a month before, caught his muzzle in the box door and could not get free in the second program on Saturday, and was scratched with his DNF. He was well under form on Sunday. So, Cruz "cruised" to the bottom ARX point each day. His closest competition on Saturday was kennelmate "Bacon" who came out of FTE as well. and finished the weekend a mid-B. With the exception of one dog who was scratched after the first program on Saturday, all our FTE's did very well. They were clean racers and looked good going down the track.

We had three very promising puppies on the weekend. Cory, Garcia, and Preston all did well and showed their clean boxbreaking style and pushed hard. Garcia and Cory moved up to Adult on Sunday and ran clean and well.

Sadly, two dogs suffered injuries that are likely to be career-ending. Paige, who has been an amazing racer in the CWA, tore her gracilis at the end of the day on Saturday. That kind of injury can be just wear and tear...there was no real incident but after looking at her, Carl elected to pull her from further racing. We are certainly grateful he stayed and helped us on Sunday despite Paige's injury. And sadly, my "Yaha" came up lame after helping to proof a puppy in practice on Saturday. She is 8 years old and can just rest on her laurels from here on out, as far as I am concerned. But no more racing for Pea...not even to make numbers.

Our conformation judges did a thorough job. First time attendee Bheki Bowman-Mealey officiated on Saturday, and found her winner in "Bacon". Second to Bomber, third to Kohl and fourth to Monkey. Hillary Frank (Whip Hill) came out to practice her dogs and judge our match on Sunday. She awarded the match to longtime CWA competitor "Maura", with Bacon picking up the 2nd and DPC leg, followed by Monkey and Kohl. After the match, I announced that Maura would retire from CWA Match competition with that win. She is six years old and has had a fine career in the CWA conformation ring, and I am proud to send her out a winner.



So, we had a nice weekend. We had over 30 dogs each day, plus puppies, and tasty food and a lot of fun. We showed our sport to the public who were willing to hike down to watch this and dealt with some adversity in the spirit of being teammates and good sportsmen and women. I personally thought that being a part of Bark in the Park was a net positive and helped us to fulfill the public education role that every dog club should strive to include in their overall programme of activities.

Next year, we hope to offer four meets and one or two practices. There are a lot of good dogs in this area who will race well--we just have to help them get trained and encourage the owners to try the racing.

e crossed the BC Aldergrove border in record time on a Friday evening. Two whippets and two humans travelled by Dodge pickup truck and trailer over 7780 km (4834 miles) in total. We passed through and stayed at least one night in all the states: Washington, Idaho, Montana, North Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin, South Dakota, and Wyoming. We couldn't have been luckier on our trip - the weather was outstanding at 24-27 degrees pretty much everyday (we had a few Americans wondering why that seemed warm), with not a drop of rain in over 3 weeks.

The scenery was beautiful - the leaves were all turning vibrant with the rich colors of fall, and we saw gently rolling hills, tumbleweeds and badlands areas. In some areas it was so flat that it seemed we were driving off the ends of the earth, and some of the sunsets were simply outstanding. We were amazed at the size of the wind turbines, especially after seeing a single blade sitting on a transportation rig.



Some of the roads were newly paved, others required a high tech sports bra. An unfortunate wasp ended up beheaded and wedged on our wipers and remained there most of the trip. I think we depleted the insect population along the way with our windshield. There was a wide assortment of road kill including deer, coyote, raccoons and an overabundance of skunks. We also saw some interesting wildlife: long tailed birds, wild turkeys, antelopes, ground squirrels and buffalo. Did you know Montana has 3 times as many cows as people?? We saw many, many, many, many acres of crops, mostly feed corn, alfalfa, sunflowers and soybeans. Most rest stops were well kept, but there was one in particular where Smoke had to relieve himself on a pile of cigarettes etc., and another where the building was completely flooded, probably due to a beaver dam.





We stayed at a few KOA campgrounds that had some cute little agility areas, and where we had numerous "Are those miniature Greyhounds?" questions. "So skinny..." "They're so soft..."

A teen boy asked me, "How come you don't have a Canadian accent?"

We viewed some large statues along the way - buffalo, humans, birds, a heron (much to Tanzy's dismay - she had a bird when she saw the giant Heron sculpture). And we were always on the lookout for interesting signs such as at a motel: "Pets ok. Horses Welcome - Stalls available".

We drove through many small towns, where they had fixed up the downtown business areas in an old-fashioned style with vintage signage and buildings full of character. Marco decided to get a haircut to support

a small town while I took the dogs for a walk. The owner was very pleased to announce that he had won an award (which was dated 1969).



but unfortunately the accents weren't anywhere to be found. After, we learned that the wood chipper used in the movie now lives in a hotel in Minnesota. We saw Fargo's walk of fame as well, which had quite a few stars from Moody Blues to Def Leppard (rock on!).

The Whippets thought North Dakota was the best, as it must be the squirrel capital of the world. We enjoyed a lot of local parks, and of course Marco had to make sure we stopped by Dodgeville to take a photo of the sign.

Tanzy took some time getting used to the smaller boxes, lower peep holes, and different location, even turningaround a couple of times. Smoke was very close to points the first day, even winning over his sister as an unusual event, and had an exciting last race, winning with two dogs justbehindhim.

Unfortunately Smoke's excitement caused him to scrape off parts of his nose, trying to get the muzzle off on the long walk down the track. And of course he had to fling and wipe his bleeding nose all over our jeans. Marco said the other dogs that were rambunctious at the boxes settled down after sniffing all the blood on his pants. The second weekend we scratched him as his nose opened up after the first race. He was pretty depressed after that.

During the next week, we checked out the House on the Rock, which was mind boggling with huge collections of dollhouses, nautical themes, mini circuses, antiques, huge automated musical instruments, gun collections, suits of armour, huge carousels and more. My eyes hurt after looking at so many items. This character had a lot of time and money on his hands, designing his own retreat out of the local rock, and only using it four times.



Mary Beth, Doug, Peggy and other locals made us very welcome the second weekend of racing, with Peggy taking us for a driving tour along Lake Michigan to see the downtown estates and Calatrava art museum along the water. 
We also visited Mount Rushmore – the scale is quite something to see, then went to see Crazy

There were wonderful cheese shops everywhere, and as we can never have too much, we loaded up on our way home. We also went


shopping and picked up all the essentials such as clothes, shoes and wine.

The following article will be of great interest to all those who are now breeding, or are considering breeding in the near or far future. The first part is a Kennel Report, first printed in the WHIPPET NEWS in April, 1969, from the Marial Kennel. The second part originally printed in June, 1975 represents an honest evaluation of how their carefully planned litter turned out. The third and final installment, dated December, 1985 concentrates on later generations. THE WHIPPET NEWS would welcome similar articles from other breeders.

#### PART I - MARIAL'S WHIPPETS, APRIL 1969

One thing we would like to see in the NEWS, and we know other people would also, is more kennel reports. In particular, kennel reports dealing with specific breeding programs and results. This would be extremely helpful to breeders just getting

started and of general interest to all. In this report, we will objectively present our thoughts and decisions on the breeding program we are trying to follow as it relates to our latest litter.

Since raising Whippets is not a profitable undertaking, we raise Whippets mainly as a hobby and campaign just a few in shows, race meets and obedience trials. The pups which do not measure up to our personal standard (which demands a combination showdog, racedog and companion dog) are either sold or humanely euthanized. We do not believe in giving dogs away as they are very seldom appreciated. However, those that we do sell are of good quality and usually would be kept if space allowed.

Late last year we decided it was time to raise another litter, since our youngest dog was approaching four years of age. When it comes time to breed again, we try to find the right stud dog and bitch that will produce a sound dog which possesses racing desire and determination as well as having an agreeable disposition. We put an emphasis on soundness as an unsound Whippet is of little value as a running animal.

In choosing a stud dog and brood bitch we studied many Whippets with different bloodlines and evaluated them on the basis of their show and race potential. An important factor in this selection is their ability to produce offspring of similar quality.

Our choice for a stud dog was Ch. Forest Slim Jim, C.D. (by Ch. Red Letter O'Lazeland ex Harbridge Lovely Lady), a white and red parti-color of good size (21 3/4" and 33 lbs.). His strong points are type, temperament (both as a companion and racer), elegant neck, brisket, topline, good rear

angulation, lovely pigment and bone. His weak points are movement, front, feet, ears and tail strong points far outweigh his faults. A hidden quality which he possesses is the ability to produce litters which are uniform in quality.

From what we have seen of the several litters Jim had already sired, the offspring was consistent in having: racing determination, temperament, size, pigment and the males' testicles were descended by four weeks of age.

This same consistency is generally apparent in Jim's own relation (brothers and sisters).

The next step was to find a brood bitch that possessed physical traits that complemented those of the stud dog. Our choice was Ch. Eyleland Paisley (by Stoney Meadows Epic ex Meander Ribbons), a brindle bitch of medium size (19" and 24 lbs). One of the reasons we selected her is that Whippets with similar breeding hold fine race as well as show records. After analyzing her breeding, we evaluated Paisley herself. Her strong points were: movement, black eyes, good ears, good feet, straight front, length of loin, tail length, straight hindquarters (when viewed from behind), and bone. Her weak points are: lack of underjaw (which gives her a "needle-nose" appearance), tendency toward a ewe neck and a rather flat back. Although very sound, she lacked the "flash" we like to see in our dogs.

The two faults we feared most from a combination of these two dogs were Jim's movement problem and Paisley's lack of underjaw. Being aware of the pedigrees of the two dogs, we felt that Jim's movement would not be a strong trait in this litter. At the same time, we felt that one half of Paisley's pedigree could be blamed for her underjaw problem and not likely to be a dominant trait in the pups.

The two dogs were bred and the

pregnancy was routine. However, only one puppy (the first) out of a litter of seven was born normally. Two (second and third) were born by the help of a contraction injection, which forced their birth. The remaining four were born by Caesarian. All the pups lived; none were deformed.

The litter consisted of five females and two males (both have their testicles descended). At this early age of three months, it appears as if the litter has turned out as we anticipated. The best qualities of Jim and Paisley prevailed. The pups are all well pigmented, have pleasant personalities, and none have what we consider to be a major fault. All are uniform in size.

Following is an individual description of each pup with comments:

- 1. Female (red brindle/black mask) sound pup with nice head and strong underjaw, rich red background color, nice pup
- 2. Female (red brindle/black mask) toes out in front, nice head with strong underjaw, one of the larger pups, very keen on chasing a lure, has elegance and style.
- 3. Female (red fawn/black mask sound pup, outstanding head and expression, one of the larger pups, very elegant and good quality.
- 4. Female (white with fawn head markings) sound pup, excels in head and neck, topline, and rear angulation; has one eye with partial eyerim. One of the best in this litter.
- 5. Female (white with brindle head and body markings) has poor head, sound pup, needs length in loin, nice angulation in rear.
- 6. Male (white and dark fawn) has weak muzzle, sound pup, better than average.
- 7. Male (white with read head markings) similar to female #4 except he has both eyerims. Very promising.

At this writing the pups are too young to evaluate with respect to movement and muscle development. If good movement is lacking in this litter, it will almost certainly be the top priority in planning our next litter. To excel in both racing and showing you must breed for good movement.

We hope that this brief summary of the reasons why we used the combination we did will be of interest to readers. It is rather unlikely that the larger kennels could prepare reports of this nature on every litter they plan, for this could amount to several volumes. However, certain kennels do have definite directions as far as breeding programs and could summarize their philosophies with respect to one or two planned litters. Only in this way can the novice breeder begin to appreciate the amount of necessary study and decision that should be part of every mating. This type of planning is to be encouraged and can only serve to benefit the future representation of our breed.

#### PART II - MARIAL'S WHIPPETS, JUNE, 1975

In re-reading the kennel report which appeared in the April, 1969 Whippet News, we found it interesting to look in retrospect at the litter described, and the steps our breeding program took from there--two generations later.

This article is intended to give a look at our rationale, evaluations, decisions and breeding results. It is done with frankness--a quality lacking in some kennels, where failures and disappointments are covered up. Breeding dogs is an inexact science, and the disappointments and failures are not personal reflections on the breeder. Inherited faults and problems should not be kept a secret, just as good qualities and wins are not.

Only having a small number of Whippets demands that careful culling and restocking be done in order to increase the chance of success. It is obvious that keeping dogs until old age severely limits competitiveness in a small operation. Our feelings are that we want to constantly improve the quality of our Whippets. We want to see that each litter we produce is better than the last. That way we know our stock is improving. Part of this concept is not having a female labeled "brood bitch." Each female we breed is expected to be better than her sire and dam, in order for us to be continually improving, and on and on it goes, each generation. Of course, this is easier said than done.

In looking back at each pup in the Slim Jim x Paisley litter, we can evaluate them as adults.

- 1. Female, red brindle, Ch. Marial's Born Free, C.D. Developed as anticipated, better than average. Well balanced. Honest racer.
- 2. Female, red brindle, Marial's Chevron (deceased). Front toed out, possessed speed, but shy and would not perform away from home. Slightly "doggy" for a female. Elegant silhouette, extreme length. About 20 1/2".
- 3. Female, red fawn, Marial's Mystic. Head not as slim as expected. Racing and showing performance would have been better if kept a lower weight. Better than average. About 20 1/2". Keen, honest racer.
- 4. Female, white with fawn head, Ch. Marial's Marshmallow. Developed as expected. Eyerim filled in. Does not cover as much ground when moving as others in litter. Well balanced. About 19 3/4". Honest racer.
- 5. Female, white & brindle. Culled at four months of age. Too short bodied; front movement too high, head common. Disposition uncooperative.
- 6. Male, white & dark fawn, Ch. Marial's King Arthur. Developed as anticipated. Possessed "needle nose" look like dam. Extremely sound, standing and moving. Better than average. About 21 1/2". Keen, honest racer.
- 7. Male, white with red head, Ch. Marial's Jimson (deceased). Developed as anticipated. Lovely head, a bit extreme in body length. Sound standing and moving. Possessed speed, but retiring personality limited racing performance. About 21 1/2".

Evaluating the litter as a whole, all had good pigment, ears, brisket, nice neck; generally sound standing and moving, speed good for size. We were not pleased with the shyness encountered. This was our first experience with it, and we have discovered this is an inherited tendency, just as movement or pigment. Five of the seven puppies were above average to high quality (four of which completed their championships, the other one picked up several points). This pleased us

very much. We were particularly pleased with the consistency of quality and felt we had a good foundation upon which to build a solid breeding program.

Although none of these six Whippets were exceptionally fast racers, King Arthur and Jimson were able to win points toward the Award of Racing Merit. Born Free, Mystic, Marshmallow, Arthur and Jimson did have racing desire, which they passed on to their get.



None of the five Whippets have been used extensively for breeding, so evaluations are based on small numbers of offspring. Such small numbers do not establish a top producing stud or brood bitch in the records. However, we feel the success or failure of a Whippet as a producer should be based on the overall consistency to produce uniform, better than average litters, as contrasted with a sire or dam able to produce litters containing six mediocre pups and one outstanding one, for example.

The qualities we determined we needed in the next generation were in order of importance: 1) medium height, 2) retention of racing desire, and 3) retention of good pigment. King Arthur had produced two oversize males, which greatly distressed us; therefore the emphasis on medium size.

The route we took to counter the size situation was to blend in English bloodlines. English Whippets, generally, seem to be of small to medium size, are shorter in body than what we had.

We purchased from Bud Gutilla Limited Edition O'Lazebrook, by Int.Ch. Laguna Leisure ex Ch. Bettebrook Minx of Merriwell (by Ch. Courtenay Fleetfoot of Pennyworth). "Eddy's" adult height was 20 1/2". He possessed good pigmentation, extreme racing desire and heart, short cobby body, deep brisket, elegant head and neck which set nicely on the shoulders. He was unsound moving, from the side and coming. He also lacked bend of stifle. Putting this together with what we had, Ch. Marial's Renfield Phoebe and Ch. Marial's Tinsel (both sired by King Arthur), gave us the best qualities of each side. We did, however, shorten the length of stride, and lose some length of head which we hope to correct in the near future. We did get a more moderate "type" body, rather than extreme in length.

We are very satisfied with the progress our breeding program has made since the beginning. It is a constant blending of bloodlines and qualities, to reach that final end product, a Whippet fitting the Standard of the Breed, that is a top race Whippet, willing obedience worker, and that has the pleasant disposition to fit well into any household.

#### PART III MARIAL'S WHIPPETS, DECEMBER 1985

This kennel report is being done ten years (three generations) following Part II. Our goals and philosophies have not changed from those stated previously. Objectively and honesty are important in evaluating the progress of a breeding program. A written evaluation such as this is very valuable to us in trying to reach our goal. Mental exercises are useful, but not as helpful as chronicling expectations, breedings, results and evaluations.

Our most important goal over the years has been to maintain the Whippet as a dual-purpose dog-one capable of successfully competing in the show ring as well as on the race track. This is not an easy goal as those breeders specializing in one aspect have a big advantage over those trying to combine all qualities for competition. We feel the Whippet must also be a stable companion, as well as a good performer.

Although we are active in racing Whippets, we do not disregard the Standard and breed strictly for speed. The Whippet Breed Standard was written to describe an athlete with distinctive breed characteristics. Breeding speed to speed is no guarantee the resulting litter will be fast. Although pedigrees are important, an impressive show or race record does not always assure the Whippet will produce offspring with the same winning qualities. To disregard conformation and breed "speed to speed" is irresponsible and damaging to the breed.

It has been said "no animal is well bred unless it is good in itself." This statement points to the fallacy of breeding to pedigree alone. We feel that this wisdom stresses the necessity of using only animals with the best conformation and temperament for breeding purposes.

The Slim Jim x Paisley litter, whelped December 1968 are all deceased. Assessing each animal for what it produced was somewhat difficult as owners did not always keep in touch to keep us abreast of their breeding and results. Consequently not every breeding and resulting get may be noted. It is my intention to highlight noteworthy combinations, ones that have gone on to appear in pedigrees of today.

- 1. CH. MARIAL'S BORN FREE, C.D. (female) Owners Bob and Jane Pruett of Ohio and Georgia. To our knowledge bred only once, to Ch. Bettebrook Benchmark and most of the litter died from toxic milk.
- 2. MARIAL'S CHEVRON (female) Breeders/owners Strauss-Arthur. Bred only once, to Ch. Marial's War Paint, C.D. Of four puppies raised, fronts were weak and temperaments shy, the same problems Chevron possessed.
- 3. MARIAL'S MYSTIC (female) Owner Andrew Bidlingmaier of Wisconsin and Arizona. To our knowledge, Mystic was bred three times. Her first litter was by Ch. Bettebrook Benchmark in 1971. It produced Ch. Marial's Royal Look of Gold, a 22" black masked fawn male never used for breeding. Look of Gold was beautiful standing but had very restricted front action. Also from this breeding was Ch. Royal Looks Mystic, a 19" blackmasked red fawn of high quality. She was bred several times and produced Ch. Royal Looks Great Expectations, Ch. Royal Looks Great White Hope, Ch. Royal Looks Noble Heritage and Ch. Ariamis Sycamore, F.Ch.

In 1973 Mystic produced a litter by Ch. Misty Moors Chalmondoley. This combination produced the well known Ch. Misty Moors Royal Huntsman. This white and brindle male has produced many champions, including Ch. Runners He's The Continental, Ch. Misty Moors Bold Ruler, Ch. Misty Moors Ravendune Corwin, Ch. Herloutam Rav'ndune Misty Moor, Ch. Cyranos Rafina Rapscallion, Ch. Rafina Paper Tiger and Ch. Rafina Rhianda of Kamara.



Mystic was then bred to Ch. MorShors Top Flight in 1975. This produced Royal Look's Smoky Topaz who went on to produce Ch. Royal Looks Winged Victory.

4. CH. MARIAL'S MARSHMALLOW (female) Owners Bob and Jane Pruett of Ohio and Georgia. To our knowledge Marshmallow was bred only twice. Her first litter was sired by Ch. Bettebrook Benchmark in 1972. That breeding produced Ch. Cricket Hearth Bristol Cream, Cricket Hearth Swan Necklace and the white and brindle Cricket Hearth Chief Joseph, ARM. Bristol Cream was a quality yellow fawn 21 1/2" male. He produced a number of champion offspring under the Dress Circle prefix including Ch. Dress Circle Hi Probability, Ch. Dress Circle Dull Moment, Ch. Dress Circle Rag Time Ric Rac, Ch. Dress Circle Stanley, Ch. Dress Circle Rock of Ages and Ch. Dress Circle Capital Gains. Bristol Cream's littermate, Swan Necklace, was a medium sized brindle bitch of good quality. She produced Ch. Dress Circle Rip-Off.

Marshmallow's second litter was sired by Ch. Stoney Meadows Pay Off in 1976. It produced Ch. Cricket Hearth Long Shot and Cricket Hearth Liza with a Z.

5. Bitch. Culled at 4 months of age.

6. AM.CAN CH. MARIAL'S KING ARTHUR, AM.CAN. C.D. (Male) Co-owned by Arthur-Strauss and Linda and Steve Buchholz of British Columbia. Arthur and his offspring have been the focus in our program. Arthur proved to be an outstanding sire of race and show Whippets. He produced 14 litters in his lifetime, the last one in 1982. Among his notable get are: Ch. Slades Jimalee Cricket, Can.Ch. Swiftsure Happy Daze, ARM, Am.Can. F.Ch., Can.Ch. Swiftsure Ragtime Galatea, Am.Can. C.D., Am.Can. F.Ch., Sailaway Dreamers Dagget, ARM, Ch. Slades Dixieland Dandi Duke, ARM, Ch.


Arthur carried on strongly in our breeding through Ch. Marial's Renfield Phoebe (out of Renfield Atta-Girl of Course). Phoebe was a lovely 20" white and fawn bitch. She was sound standing and moving although adequate, had restricted front reach. Phoebe was bred to our three-quarter English bred Limited Edition O'Lazebrook, ARM producing Ch. Marial's Phenomenon and Ch. Marial's

Phoenix, F.Ch. Phoenix was a combination of the best of his pedigree. He had beautiful head, neck, depth of body, underline, sound front and rear quarters. His reach was restricted but adequate. He was a bit short bodied for us. He was a Grade B racer and his intense desire coupled with his stable temperament and good rich pigment were things we wanted to continue in our breeding.

Phoenix (an Arthur grandson) was bred to the Arthur daughter, Ch. Marial's Tinsel, C.D., ARM (out of Renfield Lady O'Lazebrook, ARM). Tinsel was an elegant 20" bitch with lovely outline, head, neck, ears and expression. She could toe out occasionally, but moved soundly coming and going. She was white with dilute fawn markings and had a tendency toward thick bunchy muscling. She was fast enough to earn an ARM but at best, a Grade A/B racer and not 100% honest. Her temperament was exhuberant, impulsive and affectionate, but could get flightly at times. The Phoenix x Tinsel litter was whelped in 1976, producing three females and four males, including Ch. Marial's Memphis, ARM.

Memphis was a strong and elegant 21" white and dilute fawn bitch. She has good ears, a well arched neck set nicely on the body, deep strong chest and underline, sound hindquarters, broad thighs, good feet and attractive outline. She is true moving coming and going but needed more front reach. She was lacking in underjaw with a slight roman nose. There was a tendency to toe out. Memphis was an extremely fast bitch, a true Grade A. She has her dam's temperament. Memphis has gone on to produce 4 lit-



ters for us and one for Dave Gilmore (all by different sires). Her get possess many of the qualities we want and most have her racing desire (four have their ARMs, including #2 ranked racer for 1985, Marial's Whitewater, ARM). Only one of her male puppies had a testicle problem; all others had descended testicles by 2 months.

In 1977 King Arthur was bred to the English bitch, Padneyhill Moonbeam, an Eng.Ch. Deepridge Mintmaster granddaughter, with numerous Wingedfoot Whippets in her pedigree. Having great admiration for these bloodlines we asked Linda Buchholz to select our stud puppy. He was the black and white male, Ch. Marial's Padneyhill Illusion, ARM. Illusion went on to be the top ranked racer for 1979, as well as going WD at the 1980 Midwest Specialty. He was a 22 1/4" male with elegant head, pretty arched neck set well on body, good ears, deep underline, front set well under

body, good body length and breadth, sound front and rear quarters. His disposition was quite different than we were accustomed to. Illusion was very independent, stubborn and serious in nature. When in the show

ring, if he felt like it his front reach was good; if sullen front movement was mincy. He had a phenomenal finish on the track, going from 6th to 1st in a race within 20 yards. Illusion (an Arthur son) was bred to Memphis in 1981 and produced our white and blue, Marial's Thunder Bay, ARM.

Illusion was also bred to Stoney Meadows Snow Job, F.Ch. and produced Ch. Marial's Gazon Illusionist, an orange and white multiple group winner. Illusionist produced a litter out of Memphis in 1985. The litter is promising, but too young to pass judgement on.

7. CH. MARIAL'S JIMSON (male) Breeders/owners Strauss-Arthur. Bred only once, to Traymatt Swamp Candle producing Ch. Marial's Traymatt Snow Man, C.D., ARM. Due to a low sperm count Snow Man was never used for breeding.


After incorporating Limited Edition we achieved what we had hoped, to lower our size. However, restricted front movement then needed to be improved. To do that we purchased Ch. Sheridan Marial's Nikita (Ch. Sheridan Jamoca x Ch. Sheridan Bianca) from John Shelton. Nikita is a 22" brindle and white male, winner of the 1980 Midwest Specialty and sire of 17 champions. He has many outstanding qualities, and movement is one of them. Nicky sired Memphis' first litter producing Ch. Marial's Natchez, F.Ch. and Marial's Omaha Strider, ARM.

Although we don't currently own any Nikita offspring, we purhcased Ch. Locar Marial's London Fog (a Nikita grandson) from Carol Curry in 1982. London Fog (by King Arthur x Ch. Roving Roadside Attraction) is a 20" white and lemon brindle male. He is very sound, has good front movement and will figure into the future of our breeding program. He is a very keen Grade C/D racer.

The challenge of producing dual-purpose Whippets is a great one. We have been able to incorporate some of the qualities necessary to successfully compete in the show ring and race track, but still have other qualities that need to be improved or strengthened. Although we have had some disappointments, we have been very proud of our Whippet's accomplishments.

Quoting From John A. Reeve-Newson, DVM, of Kishniga Borzoi fame, "Our motto should be only the fittest, both physically and emotionally, shall survive and propagate. This should be displayed over the door of every breeder in the land--displayed and followed."




